# ELEKTRA XX IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCES

## June 11-16, 2019

For its 20th anniversary, ELEKTRA offers new versions of major artworks from its last two decades and creations that question the future of the arts linked to new technologies.



**Montréal, Monday, May 27, 2019** - The ELEKTRA festival, a flagship event of the Montréal spring, has unveiled its lineup! The 20<sup>th</sup> edition of the international digital art festival will take place from June 11 to 16, presenting some twenty local and international artists among the most innovative in digital art. During 5 days, Montréal will vibrate to the rhythm of many bold, extreme, immersive performances that won't leave anyone indifferent.

"In this pivotal year, ELEKTRA is closing its first major 20-year cycle before starting a new one in 2020 with the 5<sup>th</sup> international digital art biennale. For 20 years now, ELEKTRA has presented memorable creations, often considered to be the most innovative of the art world. That's why the 2019 and 2020 editions are perfect opportunities to both bring back key works, a few classics that left a lasting impression on the public, while also trying to anticipate what the arts linked to new technologies will become in the next 20 years. The 2019 lineup, which mainly focuses on performances, reflects these aesthetics and trends, aiming for a more intimate dialogue between humans and technologies, going beyond the simple notion of spectators by making people live more immersive, more extreme experiences."

# THREE NIGHTS OF IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCES AT USINE C



**Every night from June 13 to 15**, USINE C will host a dozen audiovisual performances, including World and North American premieres, from world-renowned artists.

8 p.m. With his latest creation for 4 dancers and exoskeletons *Repeat*, presented as a **world premiere**, artist Louis-Philippe Demers tries to imagine illusory movements by an augmented body (half-man, halfrobot), imitating the stereotypical duos of human ballet dancers. <u>www.elektramontreal.ca/louisphilippe-demers?lang=fr</u>

**Kurt Hentschläger,** an Austrian artist renowned for his extreme immersive performances, will present the **North American premiere** of *FEED.X*, the amplified version of his famous piece *FEED*. Reaching the limits of human perception and using both sensory privation and overload, it will emerge the public in an apparently infinite, kaleidoscopic architecture. Finally, during the whole festival, the public will get to interact with the robotic art installation *Colonisateur Sonore* by Jean-Pierre Gauthier, whose utopic project is to implement an interactive system on Mars before the arrival of the first humans. ## **OPENING NIGHT – THURSDAY, JUNE 13 - NIGHT #1**



Following Louis-Philippe Demers' performance, night #1 will start at 9 p.m. with international guest **Rocio Berenguer (ES – FR)**, presenting *Ergonomics*, a choreographic fiction, and a quirky, critical exploration of contemporary themes such as the future body, the urban body, the Smart City, and clichés related to innovation and startups in the digital era. <u>www.elektramontreal.ca/rocio-</u> berenguer?lang=fr

Then, Quebec digital artist **Myriam Bleau** will explore the limits between live and virtual shows. With **Eternity Be Kind**, a performance in collaboration with world-renowned international artist LaTurbo Avedon, she will propose a multidimensional, collective "mise en abyme" experience. With performer **Nien Tzu Weng**, **Peter van Haaften & Michael Montanaro** will present **Spiel** | an insitu performance for prepared mouth at 8 p.m. and 10:30 p.m. The performer becomes sort of a digital sampler, reproducing and distorting his sonic environment in the public space. ## FRIDAY, JUNE 14 - NIGHT #2



At 9 p.m., night #2 will begin with **NSDOS** (FR), returning this year with a new performance, **Sending.movement 2.0 (2019)**, in which his movements are analyzed by a tracking system making it possible, in real time, to feed data to his instruments in order to produce music related to them. With **Sending.movement 2.0**, **NSDOS** pursues the research from his residency at the Palais de Tokyo in Paris, where he was invited to perform during the entire month of November last year. **www.elektramontreal.ca/nsdos?lang=fr** 

Romanian artist **Syntax (RO)** will present the **North American premiere** of *Microark*, an audiovisual performance exploring the relationship between human perception and micro-acoustic phenomena, such as atoms and sound pixels. Such micro-acoustic phenomena are used as a basic structure for a succession of audiovisual constructions hailing from the idea that the waveform (oscillation) visually translates the abstract purity of sound. # CLOSING NIGHT: SATURDAY, JUNE 15 - NIGHT #3



First, Quebec artists **Alexis Langevin-Tétrault, Guillaume Côté & Dave Gagnon (QC-CA)** will kick off the night with their audiovisual performance **Falaises**, evoking a luminous storm at the very edge of the abyss!



To conclude the night, **Edwin van der Heide (NL)** will present the new version of his iconic *Laser Sound Performance*. This truly sensorial experience has corporal qualities that are nearly tangible, and happens in front, around, and behind the audience. # 5 NIGHTS OF IMMERSIVE PERFORMANCES AT THE SOCIETY FOR TECHNOLOGICAL ARTS - SAT

From June 11 to 15, starting at 7 p.m., the SAT will host 3 immersive performances in the Satosphere.



**ESPACIO DE DATOS (2019)**, by **Mene Savasta & Andrés Colubri (AR)** is an immersive audiovisual projection, which allows the emergence of new observation devices (interactive visualization, reduction of dimensionality) that give us the opportunity to explore vast data spaces and discover new information structures.

Then it will be the turn of the Montreal-based digital label and artist collective, **susy.technology** (QC-CA) to propose its **INDIVISIBLE (2019)** performance. A dreamlike narrative that addresses memory, moments of love and loss, and the complexities of our increasingly digitalized states of existence.

To close the Satosphere performances, the dome will host *LATENT SPACE (2018)*, where the artist **MONOCOLOR (AT)** questions the omnipresence of the virtual world around us. It is transposed into the physical space of the dome to test and explore its spatial effects in order to unmask its often proclaimed immensity.

In *Co(AI)xistence*, Justine Emard invites you to observe the interaction between actor/dancer Mirai Moriyama and Alter, a Japanese humanoid robot with artificial intelligence. An extremely moving creation that won't leave anyone indifferent, *Co(AI)xistence* can only stimulate a latent anthropomorphic desire in any human being.
